How to Survive a Tornado!



With more than a thousand tornadoes each year, the United States experiences more destruction¹ and loss of life from these storms than any other country in the world. Florida, Kansas and Texas together account for² about 300 of these storms annually³. The United States is not alone, however, in facing this weather threat. Although less common, tornadoes have been reported in countries on every continent in the world except Antarctica. Here are some practical ideas about how you can survive a tornado.

Before a Tornado

Go online and learn as much as you can about tornadoes, especially if you live in an area where they are common. You should also put together a **survival kit⁴** that includes such things as a radio, flashlight, extra batteries, a **first aid kit⁵**, clothing, bottled water and canned food. And don't forget a can opener! Make sure that both you and your family have a disaster plan ready so that you know what to do and where to go if there is a tornado.

During a Tornado

It's important that you stay aware of the weather in your area. One way to do this is to watch weather reports on TV for **extreme weather**⁶ warnings. Another way might be to listen for an emergency **siren**⁷. When you know that a tornado is nearby, go immediately to a safe place. A safe place might be a storm shelter, or it might be a basement in your home, or a ground floor room. It might be a good idea to get under some heavy furniture like a table. Always stay away from windows during a tornado.

After a Tornado

Listen to your radio to stay **up to date**⁸ on what the weather is like, and only come out when you know the danger has passed. If you (or others who are with you) are hurt, try to get the attention of the emergency services team that will soon arrive to help you.
